SAMARIANS-SAMARITANS IN TRANSLATION

Recent studies in different fields (archaeology, literature, epigraphy, exegesis) tend to demonstrate the same ethnic belonging between the native inhabitants of Samaria and of Judaea across the last centuries BCE. However, contemporary literature attests to tension and rivalry between both regions and across the centuries. The destruction of the Gerizim mount by John Hyrcanus at the end of the second century BCE seems to lead to an inevitable political and religious break between both populations. A way of expression of this struggle is to build a different ethnicity for the Samaritans.

Beyond the dissociation of "Samarians" and "Samaritans" in modern scholarship in order to name the change, the conference aims to raise additional and precise questions:

- (1) The relationships of the so-called "pre/proto-Samaritan" manuscripts of Qumran in the growing tradition(s) of the Samaritan Pentateuch. (E. Ulrich)
- (2) Editorial Attitudes Toward Legal Material in Samaritan and Qumran Traditions. (S. Metso)
- (3) Rhetoric and historicity in the descriptions of Samaritan ethnicity in Josephus' works. (R. Pummer)
- (4) One liturgy or several liturgies in Jerusalem Temple and Gerizim Mount? (M. Kartveit)
