


- Formally open to all interested parties, voluntary, consensus-based, committee work based on the

- Hybrid authority








- Social concerns are acknowledged... ...but how?

Conclusions

- Limits
 - Entry costs remain very high for CSOs
 - · Lack of political support
- Ambiguity
 - Importance of proper participation for inclusiveness
 - Participation as legitimization of private forms of regulation
- Future developments
