

Professor Brigit Toebes is an Associate Professor and Rosalind Franklin Fellow at the Department of International Law of the Faculty of Law of the University of Groningen. She specializes in international health law, for which she has established <u>Global Health Law Groningen</u> (GHLG), a Research Centre that focuses on the protection of health under international law, an approach which is unique in the Netherlands. An important overarching research theme of the centre concerns the global rise of noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) and the regulation of behavioural risk factors, in particular tobacco use and unhealthy diets.

Brigit is a legal scholar with twenty years of experience in the field of health and human rights, and she has published widely in the field (for publications see <u>here</u>). Currently she is an important player in the international discussion about global health law as an emerging field of international law. She is an ongoing consultant to various organizations, most recently as consultant for the UN Special Rapporteur on the Right to Health on health sector corruption. In 2016 she received a grant from the Dutch Cancer Society to conduct <u>research</u> concerning the rights of children to a tobacco free environment.
