- Rapid economic growth
- Demographic revolution
- Rapid educational revolution
- Rapid urbanization
- Rapid social change
- Increasing inequality
- Exploding economic expectations
- Exploding expectations for social mobility

- Finally because of the nature of government: neoliberal and conservative.

RAPID ECONOMIC GROWTH

- Previously 7 8 percent
- Around 6 percent growth rate now.
- Increasing stress on the environment
- The resource rich areas have Maoist-armed struggle: Bihar, Jharkhand, Chattisgarh and Odisha

DEMOGRAPHIC REVOLUTION

- Roughly 50 percent of the population is youth
- About 600 million between 16 40 age group
- They have exploding expectations

RAPID EDUCATIONAL REVOLUTION

- Rapid increase in literacy and rapid increase in school enrolment
- Higher education is low
- primary, secondary enrolment is higher
- Leads to educational infrastructure bursting at the seams

RAPID URBANIZATION

- The metropolitan pull
- Rapid rise of small towns, Census towns
- Increasing problems of migration, urban housing, urban sanitation and all other urban issues including urban law and order

RAPID SOCIAL CHANGE

- Changing nature of the family
- Increasing economic impact on familial relationships
- Changing nature of caste relations
- Changing nature of gender relations
- Sexual revolution

EXPLODING ECONOMIC EXPECTATIONS

- Economic growth generates aspirations among all classes of the society
- All classes are looking for better standards of life
- Increasing discontents
- Employment growth not commensurate with economic growth
- Job less growth

INCREASING INEQUALITY

- Increasing economic inequality
- Inequality is a relative concept
- Rapid economic growth leads to inequality among classes, communities and individuals
- Rapid rise of inequality between city and country-side
- Rapid rise of disparities between regions

EXPLODING EXPECTATIONS FOR SOCIAL MOBILITY

- Expectations of social mobility from lower castes
- Expectations of social mobility from women across the society
- Expectations of the social mobility from all other marginal communities and ethnic groups

EXPLODING POLITICAL EXPECTATIONS

- Indian states want more freedom from the centre
- Ethnic communities want more recognition and better accommodation
- Clamour for small states and restructuring federalism
- Proverbial Indian diversity poses renewed challenges

FINALLY BECAUSE OF THE NATURE OF THE PRESENT GOVERNMENT: NEO-LIBERAL AND CONSERVATIVE

- Majority government
- Weak opposition
- Hindu-conservatism
- Neo-liberal government
- Fading out of the social democrats from the polity
