To participate to clinical clerkships, the student agrees on the following :

- **The clinical clerkship starts on the 1st day of the month (even if this day is a Friday) and finishes on the 30th or 31st of the month**
- **The clerkship must be attended in its entirety**
- The student is subject to the working conditions of the hospital / office in which he is practicing. There is no obligation to grant leave, this being the responsibility of the head of department and / or the administration of each hospital.
- He/she should introduce himself/herself to the department or clinical unit before the start of the clerkship to obtain information's about the internal organization and the schedules
- He accepts to be on duty during nights and weekends
- **Fluent knowledge in French is required (level B2)**
