- One of the great challenges now is to name and imagine a balanced and ecological way of life that seems satisfying, meaningful and positive!





- Solastalgia diagnostic neologism
 - As opposed to nostalgia--the melancholia or homesickness experienced by individuals when separated from a loved home--solastalgia is the distress people feel because of environmental change and destruction
- Symbiocene programmatic neologism
 - From 'sumbios', Greek for 'living together' and root of 'symbiotic'
 - Word for a new era of living together for mutual benefit, to succeed the so-called 'Anthropocene'


- The need for new myths, including:
 - A larger us
 - A longer now
 - A better 'good life'
 - Redemption and restoration
- The need to build the climate movement around small groups rather than impersonal media campaigns
- The need to avoid enemy narratives and instead to dialogue with dismissive people – and to try to find a vision and language of the future that they can agree with



Charles Eisenstein


- Not letting climate change be the only agenda
 - 'the biggest threat to life on earth is not carbon fuel emissions, but the loss of forests, soil, wetlands and marine ecosystems'
- Letting go of the myth of separation

- Taking care of the earth *because we love it* and not because we fear the consequences of not doing so





