### **Advance care planning as a topic in clinical interactions**

In a societal context that values patients' involvement in clinical choices, there is an active promotion of advance care planning tools. These encompass advance directives for end-of-life care, discussions about cardiopulmonary resuscitation in hospital admission, and joint crisis plans for patients with mental health issues. In interactions in somatic and mental health care, the use of these tools often leads to complex sequences for patients, clinicians and other people involved (e.g. relatives, interpreters). In recent years, this complexity has been described in interactional, ethnographic and clinical research.

The international workshop organized in Lausanne gathers authors of these studies and allows them to exchange experiences, ideas and reflections. The working language is English (without interpreters).

The event will include several oral presentations followed by discussions. The workshop is open for master and PhD students in language sciences, researchers from other disciplines investigating the same field, as well as clinicians practicing or teaching advance care planning.
