Dean's office and the FORS Management¹

1. Starting point

Since 2008 the UNIL has funded annually a joint research program between FORS and SSP with an amount of around 1.35 Mio CHF. This joint research program FORS-SSP is based on a convention between the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (SSP) and the Swiss Centre of Expertise in the Social Sciences (FORS) which has recently been renewed until 2024. This convention provides a framework for this program. Currently 15 staff members are (partly) financed through this program (8 senior staff members, 2 post-docs as well as 5 PhD students). The program is currently organized in four so-called Mini Programs: Méthodologie d'enquête; Inégalités, Genre et parcours de vie; (In-)visibilisation des inégalités and Valeurs et politique. In these Mini Programs, 15 associate members from the faculty and FORS are involved who are not financed through this program (*see Appendix A - Members*).

The *objectives* of the program are the following;

- Develop FORS and UNIL's reputation as centers for high-quality research regarding social science methods and substantive research nationally and internationally
- Develop quantitative skills and know-how in Switzerland
- Contribute to the improvement of survey methodology
- Contribute to methodological innovations and substantive research in the social sciences
- Contribute to the discussion among different stakeholders in the area of social science methods

To achieve these objectives, the following *strategies* are applied:

- High quality publications (using FORS data) and development of guidelines for researchers and practitioners
- Collaboration in teaching (using FORS data)
- Collaboration and development of research ideas leading to grant proposals at the national and international level
- Collaboration in the organization of events
- Participation in scientific activities and strategic co-operations, such as advisory boards, editorial boards etc.

The present report provides an overview of the output and activities of the joint FORS-SSP scientific program in 2019. It is based on the answers given by involved researches to questions related to publications, teaching, event organization and participation, and research activities, or any other activity falling within the scope of the FORS-SSP collaboration.

2. Overview of the SSP-FORS activities in 2019

The activities of the joint research program encompass different types. The report starts with the publications (based on FORS-related data) (section 2.1), teaching and supervision (section 2.2), conference presentations and events (section 2.3) and other activities (section 2.4). The sections build upon information collected and provided by the members and associate members of the joint research program, by the SSP Deanship and has been supplemented with information provided by FORS. For a more detailed overview, readers are referred to the appendices.

2.1 Publications based on FORS-related data² (see Appendix B)

The year 2019 has been quite successful with respect to publications. During the accounted period the involved members and associate members produced 60 publications. Out of these publications, more than 37 were based on FORS-related data: one book, 22 articles in peer-reviewed journals (predominantly in international journals), seven book chapters, and seven working papers or other publications. Of these publications, 22 are the result of a collaboration between members of FORS and SSP, five publications have been the result of the work of FORS members. Finally 10 are publications of SSP members (sometimes with collaborations outside FORS). While 23 publications are not directly based on FORS data, they make considerable theoretical and substantial contributions to the field and expand the recognition of the collaborative program to a broader national and international scientific audience. At this level, most of FORS' surveys are used (ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort Survey, MOSAICH, PSM, SELECTS, VOTO). An exception seems to be the CCS and SHARE data.

2.2 Teaching and supervision using FORS-related data (see Appendix C)

Members and associate members of the joint program are substantially involved in teaching activities at the SSP faculty: 24 (regular) BA and MA courses and/or seminars were given either individually or jointly (in three cases only by FORS members). For 18 of these courses FORS-related data are actively used, in one case the data are archived at FORS (TREE data) and in five cases various data sets of FORS are used as examples. Moreover, eight (PhD) workshops / short courses have been given outside the University of Lausanne, five of them using FORS data. Also for teaching, all main FORS surveys are regularly used in teaching (CCS, ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort Survey, MOSAICH, PSM, SELECTS, SHARE, VOTO). In addition, FORS-based data has been used in four successfully defended PhD theses as well as in two MA theses (particularly from students in the Master Public Opinion and Survey Methodology who did methodological research on this data). Moreover, the supervision of 15 PhD theses and three MA theses is still ongoing – all using FORS data.

2.3 Presentations at conferences and other events based on FORS-related data (see Appendix D)

The members and associate members of the joint research program have been very active in promoting FORS-related data nationally and internationally at conferences and events: overall in 2019, 33 presentations or invited talks have been given by members and associate members in Switzerland as well as at international conferences and congresses abroad (Croatia, Italy, USA, etc.) in Switzerland as well as at international conferences and congresses abroad (Croatia, Italy, USA, etc.). 27 presentations were made on the basis of FORS-related data. Among these presentations, 17 are the result of joint work between members of FORS and SSP, four are the result of the work of FORS members (sometimes with collaborations outside the PHC) and six are the result of the work of SSP members (sometimes with collaborations outside FORS). Moreover, nine sessions at conferences where co-organized by members and associated members. Also here, apart from VOTO, all FORS-

related data are used (ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort, etc.). In addition, members and associate members have been jointly organizing the 10th International Conference of Panel Data Users in Switzerland with over 75 participants. One member has been the program chair of the 8th International Conference of the European Survey Research Association, one of the most important European conferences on survey research and methodology with more than 900 participants. During that conference 20 researchers from SSP and FORS contributed to the conference program, organizing sessions, presenting research, and teaching short courses.

2.4 Other (research) activities related to FORS (see Appendix E)

Besides the above reported activities, members and associate members of the joint FORS-SSP program engage in a variety of other (research) activities. In the year 2019 12 (SNF) projects (for substantial and/or methodological research using or producing FORS-related data) have been granted and one project was financed by the UNIL-EPFL program for Collaborative Research on Science and Society (CROSS). Moreover, members and associate members actively participate in scientific commissions and councils (MOSAICH commission, SELECTS commission, ESS advisory board, FORS scientific council, FORS-SSP steering committee, ISSP methodological committee, etc.). In this context, one member has been elected as president of the European Survey Research Association (ESRA). Members and associated members also act as editors, co-editors or advisory board members for journals such as the “Advances in Life Course Research”, “Swiss Journal of Sociology”, “Social Change in Switzerland” and “Survey Research Methods”. Finally, within the joint research program several members have been engaged in the coordination and organization of common seminars, including the FORS-SSP Methods and Research Meetings, and joint methodological research in the Groupe Transversal Méthodologie d’enquête. One member has been jointly responsible for coordinating the FORS Guides publication series, to which a number of other members have contributed. The FORS Guides showcase expertise relating to survey methods and data management. Several members have also been involved in the organization of the MA in Public Opinion and Survey Methodology (either as director or as scientific council member).

3. Beyond the SSP-FORS research program

Based on this overview, the joint FORS-SSP research program has proven to be an active and successful collaboration resulting in an impressive amount of publications, presentations, projects and other research activities in 2019. In this context, it should be underlined that besides this yearly output based on FORS-related data, contributions to the program and its impact go far beyond what has been detailed above.

Joint data collection initiatives

The joint FORS-SSP research program has enhanced the international recognition of FORS and UNIL as centers of competence regarding the joint development of high quality surveys (for example the Swiss Household Panel), new developments in survey methodological research, as well as in longitudinal analyses. In this regard, several collaborations between members and associate members have taken place around various data collection initiatives, such as the SHP/LIVES Cohort Study and the Selects-Civique experiment (a methodological study conducted alongside the 2019 Swiss Election Study).

MA Public Opinion and Survey Methodology

As mentioned in the last annual report, the success of the FORS-SSP collaboration also manifested itself over the last ten years in an institutional change regarding the importance of teaching quantitative methods in the curriculum of the BA and MA programs of the SSP faculty. In this context, it is important to underline the achievements of the joint MA program in Public Opinion and Survey Methodology

(MA POSM), which was established in 2013 but which, due to the withdrawal of one of three partner faculties, welcomed its last intake of students in 2019. This MA program can be considered a ‘flagship’ product of the FORS-SSP collaboration, with members on both sides contributing to teaching and the supervision of Master’s theses, and FORS acting as one of the program’s key industry partners (along with the Federal Office for Statistics and the Swiss Market and Social Research Association), offering, in particular, regular internship opportunities for students (supervised by SSP faculty), which have resulted in numerous research collaborations using FORS-related data. In turn, the MA POSM addresses key objectives of the collaborative program, including strengthening data and quantitative methods skills among social scientists in Switzerland, which importantly, is now also a key focus of the UNIL’s digital strategy with respect to teaching. Over the years it has developed a strong national – also international - reputation among colleagues in the area of survey methodology and data analysis by continuously training highly-qualified graduates who have continued their careers either in academia or in relevant private and public institutions, such as statistical offices, market research agencies or ministries. Members of the FORS-SSP Research Program actively collaborated with partners at the University of Lucerne throughout 2019 on a proposal to reform the MA POSM and relaunch it under a new name (‘MA Data, Methods and Society’), with the aim of updating the content and strengthening the curriculum relating to digital social research methods. These efforts are ongoing, but it is hoped that the program will be able to relaunch in 2021, and continue to play a key part in the FOR-SSP research program.
