

FORS-SSP Research Program Year Report 2021

June 2022

Dean's office and the FORS Management¹

1. Starting point

Since 2008, the UNIL has funded annually a joint research program between FORS and SSP with an amount of around 1.35 Mio CHF. This joint research program FORS-SSP is based on a convention between the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences (SSP) and the Swiss Centre of Expertise in the Social Sciences (FORS), which has recently been renewed until 2024. This convention provides a framework for this program. Currently 15 staff members are (partly) financed through this program (8 senior staff members, 2 post-docs as well as 5 PhD students). Moreover, the program is supported by 11 FORS staff members which are not financed by the program, but take on substantial roles as co-leaders of axes and members of the steering committee, etc.. Finally, 19 associate members from the faculty and FORS are actively contributing to the program but are not financed through it (*see Appendix A - Members*).

The *objectives* of the program are the following;

- Develop FORS and UNIL's reputation as centers for high-quality research regarding social science methods and substantive research nationally and internationally
- Develop quantitative skills and know-how in Switzerland
- Contribute to the improvement of survey methodology
- Contribute to methodological innovations and substantive research in the social sciences
- Contribute to the discussion among different stakeholders in the area of social science methods

To achieve these objectives, the following *strategies* are applied:

- High quality publications (using FORS data) and development of guidelines for researchers and practitioners
- Collaboration in teaching (using FORS data)
- Collaboration and development of research ideas leading to grant proposals at the national and international level
- Collaboration in the organization of events
- Participation in scientific activities and strategic co-operations, such as advisory boards, editorial boards etc.

In the last years, several steps have been taken to provide a stronger scientific and institutional framework for the FORS-SSP research program to strengthen its internal coherence and functionality. In this context, a Steering Committee and an annual half-day event (Atelier) to highlight recent and ongoing research have been established. In 2020, this institutionalization was further strengthened with the approval of the Platform 'DReMSS - Développement de la recherche et des méthodes en sciences sociales / Developments in Research and Methods of the Social Sciences'. This platform will

further strengthen and promote the cohesion within the program and will enhance the visibility of it and its members.

2. Developments and changes in 2021

In the framework of 2021, the former so-called mini programs were re-labeled into research axes to better mirror their broader scope and functionality of them within the program. Moreover, due to a strong overlap between two of them they were merged into one. This leaves the SSP-FORS research program with three strong, concise and interconnected research axes covering methodological and substantial areas in Social Science Research:

- 1) *“Survey methodology”*. This axis focuses on three key research areas: a) evaluation of past and current survey practice at FORS and its effects on data quality, b) optimization of data collection designs for FORS surveys; and c) preparation for the future (combining surveys with other data sources). Moreover, it is strongly interrelated with the current FORS Methodological Research Program.
- 2) *“Inequalities, gender and the life course”*. This axis addresses social inequalities over the life course with a particular focus on gender dynamics. Also here three key research areas can be identified: a) Development of gender indicators and data analysis from a gender perspective; b) Family life course and linked lives; and c) Labour market entry-exit, can be identified which have the overarching objective to increase the value of the existing FORS data and, if necessary, to develop proposals to strengthen the quality of the data that will be collected in the future, especially with regard to gender and/or life-course perspectives.
- 3) *“Data diversity and public good research”*. This axis explores, analyses and reflects on creative avenues to study diverse societies and to foster public goods through social scientific practice. It can also be divided into three key research areas: a) Research output as a public good; b) Ethical and epistemological foundations of scientific engagement (preservation of public goods); and c) Topics around diversifying data in terms of people covered and methods used to analyse these data.

As already indicated this axis is based on merging two former mini programs on “(In-)visibility of inequalities” and “Values and Policy”. This was proposed by the two former mini-program leaders during the Atelier (June 8ths 2021). Their motivation was twofold. On the one hand, they underlined the need to join forces in order to create a more inclusive, durable and attractive research axis comparable to the other two existing ones. On the other hand, they convincingly demonstrated the benefit of a broader axis on the topic of data diversity and public goods to engage proactively with emerging stakes around social scientific data and public ownership of academic research.

Furthermore, 2021 was used to implement the Platform ‘DReMSS - Développement de la recherche et des méthodes en sciences sociales / Developments in Research and Methods of the Social Sciences’. This was done in strong collaboration with the SSP webmaster and the IT center of the University of Lausanne, which contributed tremendously with their expertise and knowhow to the integration of the platform. Moreover, substantial support came also of several people within the collaborative program. We are very content that we are finally able to provide this collaborative program the needed visibility within UNIL but also to the broader research community. 3. Overview of the SSP-FORS research activities in 2021

The present report provides an overview of the output and activities of the joint FORS-SSP scientific program in 2021. In 2021, COVID-19 still affected personal lives and work-related activities like travelling and conference activities. As in previous years, the activities of the joint research program encompass different types. The report starts with the publications (based on FORS-related data) (section 2.1), teaching and supervision (section 2.2), conference presentations and events (section 2.3) and other activities (section 2.4). The sections build upon information collected and provided by the members and associate members of the joint research program, by the SSP Deanship and has been supplemented with information provided by FORS. For a more detailed overview, readers are referred to the appendices.

2.1 Publications based on FORS-related data² (see Appendix B)

The year 2021 has been quite successful with respect to publications. During the accounted period, the involved members and associate members produced 50 publications. They are based on collaborations among program members or of program members with researchers outside the program. Out of these publications, 28 were based on FORS-related data: 22 articles in peer-reviewed journals (predominantly in international journals), four book chapters, and 2 working papers or other publications. While 22 publications are not directly based on FORS data, they make considerable theoretical and substantial contributions to the field and expand the recognition of the collaborative program to a broader national and international scientific audience. As in the previous year, at this level, most of FORS' surveys are used (ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort Survey, MOSAiCH, SHP, SELECTS, VOTO, CCS)³. An exception remains SHARE data, which is however used in the HEC faculty that is not part of this collaboration.

2.2 Teaching and supervision using FORS-related data (see Appendix C)

Members and associate members of the joint program are substantially involved in teaching activities at the SSP faculty: 31 (regular) BA and MA courses and/or seminars were given either individually or jointly. For 29 of these courses FORS-related data are actively used, and in two cases, various data sets of FORS are used as examples. Moreover, although still a pandemic year six workshops / short courses / guest courses have been given outside the University of Lausanne (online), all of them using FORS data. Also for teaching, all main FORS surveys are regularly used in teaching (CCS, ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort Survey, MOSAiCH, SHP, SELECTS, SHARE, VOTO). In addition, FORS-based data has been used in 9 successfully defended PhD and MA theses (particularly from students in the Master Public Opinion and Survey Methodology who did methodological research on this data). Moreover, the supervision of 14 PhD theses and 8 MA theses is still ongoing – all using FORS data.

2.3 Presentations at conferences and other events based on FORS-related data (see Appendix D)

Although in 2021 the still ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has led to many cancellations of conferences, workshops and outreach activities. Nevertheless, the members and associate members of the joint research program have been very active in promoting FORS-related data in 2021. Overall 37 (in comparison to 2020 where we had 26) presentations or invited talks have been given by members and associate members by national or internationally online events. 30 presentations were made on the basis of FORS-related data at least half of them as the result of joint work between members of the

program or with associated members. Moreover, ten additional activities such as conference session / workshops / seminars have been co-organized by members, three of them actively using and promoting FORS data. Also here, apart from VOTO, all FORS-related data are used (ESS, EVS, ISSP, LIVES-FORS Cohort, etc.).

2.4 Other (research) activities related to FORS (see Appendix E)

Besides the above reported activities, members and associate members of the joint FORS-SSP program engage in a variety of other (research) activities. In the year 2021, 13 projects have been submitted to either regional, national or European funding agencies. 2 (SNF) projects and 6 alternative funded projects (for substantial and/or methodological research using or producing FORS-related data) have been granted. Three projects are currently under review – among those a promising collaboration to establish the Generations and Gender Programme (GGP) as a new Social Science Research Infrastructure in Switzerland. FORS together with staff from the SSP faculty is also involved in building a new European political science infrastructure Monitoring Electoral Democracy (MEDem). With the host country in Austria, FORS in collaboration with other universities seeks to participate in this distributed consortium through hosting a “Center for Survey Data” that will coordinate major political science survey projects in Europe.

Moreover, members and associate members actively participate in scientific commissions and councils (MOSAiCH commission, SELECTS commission, ESS advisory board, FORS scientific council, FORS-SSP steering committee, ISSP methodological committee, etc.). In this context, two member functions as Secretary General of the International Social Survey Programme (ISSP). Members and associated members also act as editors, co-editors or advisory board members for journals such as the “Advances in Life Course Research”, ‘Acta Sociologica”, “Swiss Journal of Sociology”, “Social Change in Switzerland” and “Survey Research Methods”. Finally, within the joint research program several members have been engaged in the coordination and organization of common seminars, including the FORS-SSP Methods and Research Meetings, and joint methodological research in the Groupe Transversal Méthodologie d’enquête. One member has been jointly responsible for coordinating the FORS Guides publication series, to which a number of other members have contributed. The FORS Guides showcase expertise relating to survey methods and data management.

4. The SSP-FORS research program in context

Based on this overview, the joint FORS-SSP research program has proven to be an active and successful collaboration. Even as 2021 remained challenging due to the ongoing pandemic it produced an impressive amount of publications, presentations, projects and other research activities in this year. In this context, it should be underlined that besides this yearly output based on FORS-related data, contributions to the program and its impact go far beyond what has been detailed above.

Joint data collection initiatives

The joint FORS-SSP research program has enhanced the international recognition of FORS and UNIL as centers of competence regarding the joint development of high quality surveys (for example the Swiss Household Panel), new developments in survey methodological research, as well as in longitudinal analyses. In this regard, several collaborations between members and associate members have taken place around various data collection initiatives, such as the SHP/LIVES Cohort Study and the Selects-Civique experiment and the in 2020 initiated FORS COVID-19 MOSAiCH survey and SHP (either as proposers of questions and /or coordinating the research activities around the FORS COVID-19 surveys).

Collaborations with LIVES, LINES and GREC

The FORS-SSP program is historically rooted in the collaboration between various institutional groups at UNIL (MISC and PAVIE, LINES from 2011 onwards) as well as different FORS projects and activities. The original research lines developed in these earlier collaborations remain until today and are reflected in the different mini programs of the FORS-SSP research program. However, it has become enriched and strengthened through the lively exchange and fruitful collaboration with several other important actors: first with the LIVES Centre which has been from its start in 2011 onwards very much intertwined with the FORS-SSP research program on the basis of methods, research topics and persons involved. This strong collaboration contributed profoundly to the increasing importance of – in particular the collection of high-quality longitudinal data as well as the accompanying methodological tools for the analyses – on the regional, national and international level. A further collaborator is GREC which has been developed as a joint research unit within SSP and which deepens the expertise on electoral behavior.

MA Public Opinion and Survey Methodology

As pointed out in several annual reports, the success of the FORS-SSP collaboration has also manifested itself over the last ten years in an institutional change regarding the importance of teaching quantitative methods in the curriculum of the BA and MA programs of the SSP faculty. In this context, it is important to underline again that the joint MA program in Public Opinion and Survey Methodology (MA POSM) contributed to this institutional change. It was an – internationally recognized - ‘flagship’ product of the FORS-SSP collaboration, with members from both collaboration partners contributing to teaching and the supervision of Master’s theses. The internship opportunities offered at FORS resulted in numerous research collaborations using FORS-related data. It has produced highly qualified graduates who have continued their careers either in academia or in relevant private and public institutions, such as statistical offices, market research agencies and ministries. Given that the SSP faculty currently does not offer a continuous, well-aligned and consistent quantitative BA and MA education, it seems strongly advisable to explore whether this program could be updated and relaunched. Such an initiative could yield substantial benefits. Since the closure of the MA POSM, it has become challenging for many colleagues within the collaborative program to recruit highly qualified graduates for their research projects. Moreover, looking at the rather low numbers of newly registered MA students in the general Social Sciences Master program, the establishment of an international and specialized Master program could offer an important opportunity of attracting additional students to SSP and UNIL. Therefore, we would like to discuss possibilities with the Dean’s office in 2022.

5. Future outlook of the program

Regarding the future of the program, in 2021 first steps have been taken to engage, in particular, with the senior members in a discussion about the future vision of the program. It has become clear that two issues will be important for shaping the program in the coming years:

1. the continuous support and active engagement of all, but particularly the senior members of the program; and
2. a strategic discussion regarding the integration of new research initiatives around emerging substantial and methodological projects and topics in the Social Sciences where FORS is involved in the program activities.

To further strengthen the commitment of members, more occasions should be created to foster exchange among all members. In this regard, the newly established annual Atelier serves already the purpose of bringing all members and associate members together and informing them about ongoing activities within the different research axes. This Atelier, however, does not allow for an in-depth

discussion and exchange about more strategic issues within the program, such as future strategic alignments. In this regard, the steering committee decided to establish an annual senior staff meeting (start in 2022). This meeting should give the senior members the possibility to enter into a more thorough discussion of the overall strategic orientation of the program and the work within the different research axes in particular. More concretely, it will offer opportunities to foster the exchange of new ideas and initiatives and discuss options for their practical implementation within the program. Moreover, a social activity (such as a common dinner) will be launched in 2022 to support a more personal exchange between members and associate members.
