INTRODUCTION

We are pleased to invite you to this Symposium held in honor of Professor Angelika Bischof Delaloye, who retired from her position as Professor of Nuclear Medicine and Head of the Department of Nuclear Medicine on August 31, 2009, after more than 41 years of activity at the University Hospital in Lausanne.

Indeed, she started working on July 1, 1968 as a medical doctor, getting a dual specialization in internal medicine (1980) and nuclear medicine (1982). Her clinical activity covered all the fields of nuclear medicine always keeping the patient at the center of concern. Her research interests included pediatric nuclear medicine, nephro-urology and nuclear oncology, especially radionuclide therapy, to which she contributed sig-

nificantly. As a past-president of the Swiss Society of Nuclear Medicine and of the European Association of Nuclear Medicine, she worked tirelessly for the advancement of the field in our country, in Europe and in the world. She is an associate editor of the *European Journal of Nuclear Medicine and Molecular Imaging*, as well as Editorial Board Member of eight other scientific journals. She held the prestigious *Cassen Lecture* of the Society of Nuclear Medicine in 2004.

As a young retiree, she is still actively involved in the field of nuclear medicine, as an expert for the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) and various scientific committees, and still has many international appointments and lectures at many upcoming conferences. Thus, you will still have the pleasure to meet or listen to her for years to come.

We have prepared a program covering a wide variety of nuclear medicine diagnostic applications in oncology and cardiology, as well as the growing part of nuclear medicine dedicated to therapy with internationally known speakers. A special lecture will be dedicated to nuclear medicine in developing countries.

We look forward to seeing you in Lausanne for this special event.
