Description of the programme	The Indo-Swiss joint research programme in the Social Sciences is designed to encourage and initiate research collaborations between Swiss and Indian social scientists on topics of mutual interests with the aim to intensify interaction between scholars and research institutions of the two countries as to promote sustainable bilateral collaboration.
Organising entities	The Indo-Swiss joint research programme in the Social Sciences is jointly organised by the Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR) and by the University of Lausanne (UNIL) as Associate Leading House of the Indo-Swiss Joint Research Programme (ISJRP) financed by the Swiss State Secretariat for Education, Research and Innovation (SERI).
Description of the grant	The Scholars Exchange Grants (SEG) are designed to fund visits of researchers in the social sciences between Switzerland and India, for joint research, field research, teaching exchange, joint development of a research proposal, presentations in conferences.
Research area	Social Sciences in a broad sense.
Goal	To initiate or intensify longstanding research collaboration between Indian and Swiss social scientists.
Amount per grant	Swiss side: CHF 10,000 maximum per project
Project duration	The visits can be spread over a duration of maximum 12 months.
Eligibility	Indian main applicant
	The main applicant must hold a PhD and/or a senior permanent position in a university/institution located in India.
	Applications will be accepted only from an Indian citizen or an Indian permanent resident.
	Swiss main applicant
	The main applicant must hold a PhD and/or a senior permanent position in an eligible institution located in Switzerland (cantonal universities, Swiss federal institutes of technology, Federal and cantonal research institutions, universities of applied sciences and other research institutions eligible for receiving federal funding).
	Applications will be accepted only from a Swiss citizen or a Swiss permanent resident.
	Additional social scientists
	Additionally to the main applicant, the SEG project may include additional researchers and PhD students, postdoctoral social scientists or scientific collaborators on the Swiss and the Indian sides. The total number of

	participants on each side should not exceed three.
	Each applicant can submit maximum one application.
Funding principles	Indian funds
6 K - K	Indian funds will contribute to cover the travel costs of Indian researchers to Switzerland (max. one travel per scientist) and the living expenses of Swiss visitors in India.
	Swiss funds
	Swiss funds will contribute to cover the travel costs of Swiss researchers to India, and the living expenses of Indian visitors in Switzerland.
	Items not covered
	• Equipments;
	Salaries and insurance;
	• Expenses for scientific sabbaticals;
	Costs caused by illness or accidents;
	Overhead costs.

Application deadline	Completed and signed applications must be submitted not later than 28 February 2017. Late and incomplete applications will not be accepted.
Evaluation and selection	Joint applications will be evaluated by ICSSR on the Indian side, and by a scientific committee called by UNIL as Associate Leading House and EPFL as Leading House of the Indo-Swiss Joint Research Programme on the Swiss side.
	 Evaluation criteria: (not listed in the order of priority): Scientific merit of the proposed activities Anticipated outcomes of the project Benefits of the proposed activities for the establishment of sustainable research partnerships and institutional links between Swiss and Indian institutions Added value of the visits for ongoing research and teaching where applicable, on both sides Potential for follow-on collaborative activities Expertise and complementarities of the two partners Feasibility of the proposed approach Qualifications and experience of the applicants
	The Indian main applicant will be notified by ICSSR, the Swiss main applicant by UNIL.
	The results are intended to be announced in June 2017.
Reporting	Grant recipients will have to submit a brief progress report after 6 months of the project, and a final scientific and financial report at the latest two months after the end of the grant period.
Joint Seminar	Subject to the availability of funds, an Indo-Swiss joint seminar may be organised in 2017 in Switzerland. Selected social scientists will be expected to attend the seminar to present their project to their peers.
